Spring 2019 On a Wing and a Prayer From Jan's Desk





Good riddance to the ice and snow! Trying to compensate for late and/or cancelled deliveries is always a challenge. Hunger doesn't take a break during inclement weather, and we are always amazed at the number of our families who venture out.

We prepared and braced ourselves for the Government shut down not knowing exactly what impact it would have on us. The demand we anticipated never materialized and the largest inconvenience was assisting some of our families who were experiencing disruptions with their food stamps.

This year, as hard as it may be to imagine in our affluent Chester County, we have assisted more of our clients living in their cars or in wooded areas than ever before. The creativity demonstrated by these people is commendable. A \$10 gym membership guarantees a shower, hanging in a variety of establishments supplies air conditioning, and meals can be obtained from a \$1.00 menu and/or cooking on a portable grill. Some families resorted to using their savings to live in a budget hotel while working and saving for a security deposit and their first month rent. Many of our families live paycheck to paycheck, and if they incur a burden that prevents them from meeting their financial responsibilities, they suffer from anxiety and stress which inhibits their ability to deal with these situations. Through referrals to other organizations and our Emergency Fund, we have been able to assist some of these clients to overcome their adversities.

In a continued effort to best serve the needs of our families, we periodically conduct an anonymous survey to disclose unmet needs. The survey also encourages comments on their Pantry experiences. The information recently gathered indicated the majority of our families were satisfied with both the quantity and quality of the food offered. Perhaps the most surprising request received was for more pet food! We do receive and offer a limited amount of donated dog and cat food, but our mission does not support purchasing pet food. Realizing the comfort and companionship derived from pets, if any pet lovers would be interested in conducting a pet food drive or making a designated donation toward pet food, I'm sure our families would welcome your assistance.

Last, but not least, we are hopeful that the many tax law changes this year will not have a detrimental impact on charitable giving. The amount of food we receive from the Federal and State Government represents less than 1% of the food we distribute. Our entire service depends on the generosity of our donors. We are blessed and appreciative of all of you that continue to support us and allow us to continue our mission of feeding our neighbors.


Starting over 50 years ago by giving away a bag of basic groceries, we have evolved to the equivalent of a small grocery store providing a full spectrum of groceries for 10 to 12 days out of a month, including fresh meat, produce, milk, eggs, cheese, butter, yogurt, sliced bread, a variety of canned goods, condiments, spices etc.

Over the years we have added programs to address what we perceive and/or our clients express a desire for:

- Thanksgiving dinner program which includes everything you could want for Thanksgiving dinner and a full breakfast the next day.
- Our adopt-a-family Christmas program when we provide presents for over 500 children in response to their requests.
- Back-to-school supplies for school-age children which includes a backpack filled with supplies.
- Sneaker program where once a year we provide a quality pair of sneakers to children, veterans and seniors.
- Home deliveries to those clients who are home bound.
- Summer lunch program to families with children who during the school year get their lunch at school.
- BEAP.....Our counselors review with the client and assist them in receiving aid from every federal, state, county and private agency program for which they are eligible.

None of this is possible without our dedicated volunteers and your continuing support for which we are very grateful.

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Benefit Enrollment Assistance Program (BEAP)

The Pantry's Benefit Enrollment Assistance Program (**BEAP**) helps our clients apply for social service benefits, provides case management and finds referrals for other services to meet their food, housing and medical needs. Many clients are not aware of their eligibility for benefits or how to enroll. It is essential that our clients know of these opportunities.

Clients have varied abilities and expectations when it comes to enrolling for benefits, and the application process has often been a significant obstacle to getting enrolled, particularly in healthcare. Many also face challenges such as limited access to technology, low literacy skills, and language or cultural barriers.

BEAP counselors provide one-on-one assistance to navigate the enrollment process in many different ways - online, by phone, in person, or through a traditional mail-in application. Also, household budgeting classes and employment opportunities are on-going points of emphasis. Since its inception in 2010, BEAP has helped 1,975 clients, assisting with 1,167 program enrollments and 1,290 referrals to other programs and services. BEAP's volunteer counselors are Randy Blough, Rob Chapman, Elaine Coia Neary, Bill Seybold and Kevin Zeeger.
