A big thank you to all of the donors that supported our \$10,000 Donor Challenge. This year, once again, our donor increased his matching donation to \$12,000 and we raised an additional \$29,315!

Kurt Dadey, Barbara Luminella, Claire McGovern and Jack Moyer each brought their compassionate and dedicated service to the Pantry for many years and will be missed immensely by their Lord's Pantry family.

It is such a welcoming sight to see nature taking its course, brightening our surroundings with color and new life! It is a time when thoughts turn to summer vacations and enjoying the outdoors. Unfortunately, not all of our neighbors look forward to the same. Now that the weather is warming up the utility companies are less lenient toward overdue bills, issuing Shut Off Notices more readily. Utility bills, gas prices and food prices continue to rise relentlessly. Many of our clients are on fixed incomes that makes it very difficult to absorb these many increases. Our clients turn to us out of desperation with many different unmet needs. We receive calls on a daily basis requesting assistance with security deposits, rental assistance, cell phone and utility bills. A very small portion of our budget has been designated through the "Director's Fund" to aid our registered clients. By partnering with many other non-profit organizations, we are able to assist several of our clients. To qualify, they must meet certain requirements, such as being able to support these expenses in the future. If you would like to support this program, you may do so by designating "Directors Fund" in the memo of your check or online donation.

Listening to our clients' personal circumstances daily makes you realize how truly blessed you are. We sincerely thank you all for your kindness and generosity that allows us to continue our mission and serve our neighbors.
