Since the Lord's Pantry is 100% volunteer and 95% of the volunteers fall into the "at risk" category for Covid-19, it was not an easy decision to keep open. All of our volunteers were notified that we would remain open with modifications to our operations and assured them that we fully understood anyone's decision not to continue. It was only through the resilience of our dedicated skeleton crew and the compassion and generosity of the community that we have been able to continue.

The past few months have been so challenging for everyone. It makes you realize

In the beginning, when it was nearly impossible to place our usual "bulk" orders with local grocery stores, many of the local businesses and restaurants came to our aid with their contacts and donations. Many of our donors donated their stimulus checks or greatly increased their usual donations. It was so gratifying to see how our community pulled together to lend a hand to our less fortunate neighbors. At one point, we had to stop accepting food donations because we were filled to capacity – that has never happened even during the holiday season. Everyone wanted to help and many came up with creative ideas including sewing and selling masks; donating restaurant meals to our clients; food drives held in organizations, companies and neighborhoods, monetary collections, collecting school supplies; diaper drives and a shredding event just to name a few. The most touching moment for me was when I received a call from a past client who insisted on gratefully giving back by donating almost \$1,000 worth of meat through his supplier.

Regretfully we were forced to cancel our Sneaker Distribution this year due to the logistics of the distribution. Our families were very disappointed but understood. Our Thanksgiving Distribution will be changed to a drive-thru distribution for the safety of our volunteers and clients. Our Adopt-A-Child for Christmas Program will also have to be modified, as we will **ONLY** be able to accept **monetary donations** due to the logistics of this Program. All qualifying families will receive one Gift Card per child to do their own Christmas shopping. We know many donors will be disappointed, as they love to shop and wrap – it is just not possible this year.

Benefits Enrollment Assistance Program Turns 10

On April 6, 2010 Pantry volunteer Bill Seybold met with a client named Robin to complete a PA Tax and Rent Rebate application, thus kicking off our Benefits Enrollment Assistance Program (BEAP).

Over the next ten years, BEAP volunteers have assisted hundreds of clients to apply for federal, state and local programs available to them and to find referrals for other services to meet their food, housing and medical needs. Seniors are counseled on getting the most from their Medicare coverage. Property tax appeals are offered to our mobile home owners. Used furniture and household items are provided to families in need. Thousands of dollars in rebates and savings have been secured for our clients.

Since March of this year, BEAP has provided information for Covid-related programs, including expanded food stamp benefits, the stimulus payments, mortgage and rental assistance, the eviction moratorium, and programs for school meals, emergency cash, and mental health support. The BEAP program is essential for the well-being of so many of our clients.
